ORDER MODIFYING PROCEDURES AND COLLATERAL FORFEITURE
SCHEDULE FOR CERTAIN PETTY AND MISDEMEANOR OFFENSES COMMITTED
IN ACADIA NATIONAL PARK

It appearing that numerous violations of Title 36 of the Code of Federal Regulations occur in Acadia National Park, which is within the jurisdiction of this Court, said violations generally being the petty and misdemeanor offenses identified in the attached *Collateral Forfeiture Schedule*, and that the collateral forfeiture amounts proposed by the Government are reasonable and—where appropriate—consistent with the State of Maine’s penalties for violations of Maine law and amounts imposed in other districts, and it further appearing that it would be for the benefit and convenience of all concerned that (1) Park Rangers be authorized to issue Violation Notices to be processed through the Central Violations Bureau for the specified offenses, and (2) a plan be established whereby persons committing certain offenses in Acadia National Park may dispose of said cases by forfeiture of collateral in a fixed amount, and subject to a processing fee established by the Central Violations Bureau, without the necessity of appearing before a United States Magistrate Judge, it is:

ORDERED, as follows:

1. The Court’s *Order Fixing Penalties for Minor Offenses at Acadia National Park* dated March 22, 2019, which dealt with Violation Notices issued in connection with violations of Title 36 of the Code of Federal Regulations, had attached to it a *Schedule of Amounts*

of Penalties updated in March 2019. The *Schedule of Amounts of Penalties* is hereby superseded by the attached *Collateral Forfeiture Schedule* (“Schedule”).

2. Any Park Ranger authorized to make arrests or issue violation notices in Acadia National Park for offenses appearing in the attached Schedule may issue a Violation Notice, in the form provided by law, for offenses appearing in said Schedule committed in Acadia National Park.
3. When a Park Ranger issues a Violation Notice, the Park Ranger or other agent or employee of Acadia National Park shall, within a reasonable period of time, forward a copy of the Violation Notice to the Central Violations Bureau at P.O. Box 780549, San Antonio, Texas 78278-0549.
4. In accordance with Federal Rule of Criminal Procedure 58(d) and Local Rule 158, a person charged by Violation Notice with an offense listed in the attached Schedule—other than an offense for which a mandatory appearance (“M/A”) is required—may avoid the necessity of appearing in court by paying any processing fee required by the Central Violations Bureau and the collateral forfeiture amount established in the Schedule.



5. A Park Ranger may order an offender to appear in court at a specified time and place, in lieu of permitting an offender to pay the collateral forfeiture amount established in the attached Schedule, if the Park Ranger concludes that the offense was of an aggravated nature.

6. Nothing in this Order shall restrict the authority of a Park Ranger to lawfully arrest an offender.
7. This Order shall continue in effect pending further Order of this Court.
