- e. [If agreement contains a waiver of right to appeal]

- i. Ordinarily you would have the right to appeal the sentence or the sentencing procedures or any error that I might make in these proceedings. But you are agreeing here not to take any such appeal [if the sentence I impose is _____ months or less]. Do you understand?
